CALL COMMITTEE UPDATE

The MSP was brought before the church council for approval in March and then submitted to the synod. The call committee is currently setting a meeting date with Pastor Lauren Kirsch-Carr, the assistant to the bishop for mobility, in order to discuss her field of candidates.

Dear friends in Christ,

As we continue our journey to Holy Week this month I would like to commend our mid-week Lenten dinner church services to you. We meet each week on Wednesday at 6:30 pm to share in a meal, worship, and holy conversation. These times have been filled with the Holy Spirit giving life and energy to those who are gathered. This was a new service format this year and admittedly, I was nervous about it as it was so drastically different from what we have done in the past, but the response has exceeded my every expectation.

I really do adore this time of worship because it is so different from our Sunday mornings. It's a way of connecting with the early church and how they would often gather together to worship in someone's home around a meal and share in remembering all that Christ had done. There is not a typical "Sunday sermon" instead I've been introducing a Biblical person and after giving a little background on the person, asking the tables to share the image they've always had of this person. After they've shared there are multiple envelopes with different possible images of this person to consider how that image might change how you understand passages of Scripture. It's my hope that we take this time to talk about the Holy Scriptures, our own preconceived notions, and how stepping outside of those can help us understand the Word in a whole new light. There is truly something holy about gathering with your brothers and sisters in Christ around a meal and having space to praise God and be in fellowship. This is also an easy kind of worship service to invite a friend to who may not have a familiarity with church, so I encourage you to invite someone you know who might be seeking to come to our dinner church.

I have received questions of if we can continue our dinner church services. We will continue to have them once a month on the first Tuesday of each month at 6:30 pm.

I hope you will take note of our Holy Week worship opportunities this year. There are a few things that are a little different. For Maundy Thursday we will meet in the gym again and we will worship and take time to remember and better understand what the Seder meal was and is and how it is still important to us today as Christians. On Good Friday we will have prayer stations open in the gym from 10:00 am – 7:30 p.m. You are invited to come and travel them as you desire. It is a self-guided time of prayer and reflection and you make take as much time as needed to experience the stations. I look forward to seeing you all in worship!

HOLY WEEK SCHEDULE

Palm/Passion Sunday, April 14, 2019 – 8:30 / 11:15 am traditional, 10:00 GiG Praise

For our traditional services, we will gather in the gym to begin our Palm Sunday procession with palms. we hear the story of Jesus' triumphant entry into Jerusalem and follow him as he journeys towards the cross and his death. This reading will form our worship service as we commune after hearing about the Last Supper; offer our gifts of time and money after Jesus discusses our need to prepare; pray for all people after Jesus prayed in the garden; confess our faith in Christ Jesus after Peter denied his; and mourn through song as we hear of Jesus' trial, death and burial.

For our GiG praise service we will gather in the Sanctuary and journey from the triumphant entry of Christ to Jerusalem through to his powerful Passion for us on the cross by using Scripture and music to engage us in the story. Our children will be our palm bearers as they join us after Sunday school.

Maundy Thursday, April 18, 2019 – 7:00 pm A Christian Seder in the gym

On this evening we “remember the night in which he was betrayed.” Jesus shared a Passover Seder with his disciples, washing their feet, and giving them a new commandment to love one another. We will join together in Christian worship with a remembrance of the holy meal that our Jewish brothers and sisters celebrate still.

Good Friday, April 19, 2019 – 10:00 am – 7:30 pm Prayer Stations in the gym

You are welcome to come and travel the prayer stations as you have time. This is a self-guided time of reflection and meditation on the holiness of this day.

Good Friday, April 19, 2019 – 8:00 pm Tenebrae Service

Using a service of Tenebrae, known as the service of darkness, we will hear of Jesus' Passion and meditate on each action that took him to the cross. Candles will be extinguished as we progress through this service leads us into the darkness of Christ's death and burial. We depart in silence awaiting our time to gather again at the tomb on the first day of the week to hear the story continue

Easter Sunrise, April 21, 2019 – 6:30 am Traditional

Gathering in pre-dawn darkness, we recall the journey to the tomb of the faithful women who followed Jesus and came on that first day of the week to complete his burial. Their discovery of the empty tomb gave them both hope and fear – until they were greeted by the risen Christ. As darkness turns to daybreak, we celebrate the darkness of sin and death giving way to the light of Jesus' victory over the grave.

Easter Festival Service, April 21, 2019 – 8:30 / 11:15 am Traditional

We will continue our celebration of our Lord's Resurrection around the “Feast of Victory” at Holy communion. Different lessons, hymns, anthems and sermon will give us opportunity to come to more than one Easter celebration today! Invite your friends and neighbors who might not have a place to celebrate this resurrection victory over the grave! “Christ is risen! He is risen indeed!”

GiG Praise Easter Celebration, April 21, 2019 – 10:00 am

We celebrate our Lord's victory over the grave with current praise songs giving glory to our risen and victorious Lord! We will hear the Word telling us of Jesus overcoming death and opening the way to life eternal and respond with our voices lifted in songs of celebration. Our children will participate in an Easter egg hunt and party during Sunday school and then join us in worship.

This month I was surprised to find an article about-MSG not being the villain it has been commonly thought to be by many of us for years. This is the edited version from Environmental Nutrition about MSG. The question was asked if there is any real reason for MSG's bad reputation which was explained in the following article.

What is MSG? A Japanese chemistry professor in 1908 investigated the chemistry contributing to a particular savory flavor. He found the components were sea salt and glutamate-- In other words monosodium glutamate.

Glutamate is one of twenty amino acids- the building blocks of protein- but is also an important neurotransmitter. Your body synthesizes about 50 grams of glutamate each day. Glutamate makes up 8-10% of most protein foods. The cells lining your intestine use almost all the glutamate you get from food to fuel their constant regeneration. In a single day the average American ingests one half gram of MSG along with 13 grams of naturally occurring glutamate from food.

In the mid 1990s after years of receiving reports of MSG producing symptoms such as headache and nausea, yet being unable to confirm that MSG was the true culprit, the Food and Drug Administration (FDA) took further steps. They asked an independent scientific group to examine the safety of MSG. This group found that some sensitive individuals who consumed three grams or more of MSG without food may experience short term temporary and generally mild symptoms such as headache, numbness, flushing tingling, palpitations and drowsiness. A typical serving of food with added MSG contains less than half a gram. The conclusion was MSG was safe. However those individuals who may be sensitive to MSG, should avoid it as they would any food to which they are sensitive.

A simple vegetable broth seasoned lightly with salt will taste a little bland. If the same broth is seasoned with MSG the flavor of the vegetables will be more pronounced producing a satisfying mouth feel without increasing the total amount of sodium. Because MSG is 12% sodium and table salt is 39% sodium, cutting salt by one-third and replacing it with MSG reduces sodium by 25% without compromising taste. For some persons who have little appetite, adding MSG as a flavor enhancer may improve appetite. In these two examples MSG may be more than just safe but even beneficial.

This information lets us look at what we think is common knowledge - to question the validity of this older" knowledge"
